




Randen is the nickname of the Keifuku Electric Railroad.

The Arashivama Line, called "Randen", opened in 1910 as the "Arashiyama Electric Tram". Since first opening its doors, Randen has continued to run alongside the history of Kyoto as the city's only tram line.

Arashiyama Main Line

This line connects Shijō-Ōmiya to Kyoto's popular sightseeing area of Arashiyama, It runs on the only tram segment in Kyoto, stopping at the numerous historical sites along the line that span the years from ancient to modern times,

Arashiyama-Sagano

Crowds of tourists from Japan and overseas visit this popular area where the Togetsu-kyo Bridge, Road of the Bamboo Forest, and a number of famous temples dot the rich, natural landscape in all four seasons. ·Get off at A13 Arashiyama



Tenryuji Temple

This temple was built by the ruling shogun, Takauji Ashikaga, who dedicated the temple to pray for the repose of the soul of Emperor Go-Daigo. The temple features a number of places of interest, including the historic and beautiful Sogen-chi Garden, created by founder Soseki Muso.



·Get off at ATB Arashiyama Station.

Kurumazaki Jinja Shrine

This shrine is dedicated to Confucian scholar Yorinari Kiyohara from the late Heian period. The Geino Jinja Shrine (Shrine for Entertainers) located on the premises is a popular power spot for the many celebrities and entertainers

·Get off at MO Kurumazaki-Jinja Station.

Rokuōin Temple

The Hodoji Temple of Mt. Kakuyu was founded on the orders of Yoshimitsu Ashikaga to pray to add years to his life. Tales are told of



flocks of wild deer appearing when the Rokuōin Temple was first erected as the Kaisan-do (hall where the statue of the founding priest is placed), from which it received its name. Although Hodoji Temple was destroyed during the Onin War, Rokuoin Temple was restored and still offers visitors a glimpse of its past glory. The beautiful autumnal-tinted maple leaves are also popular with visitors.

·Walk about 4 minutes from All Rokuōin Station.

Toei Kvoto Studio Park

This is a theme park for movies located in Uzumasa, the home of Japanese films. Visitors can watch historical films and experience the world of period dramas with open sets, events and attractions! This is a popular location for shows featuring ninjas and masco



·Walk about 5 minutes from A7 Uzumasa-Kōryūji Station. ·Walk about 2 minutes from B1 Satsueisho-mae Station (Satsueisho Exit)

Nijo-jo Castle

Heijo Palace was built as the base of the Tokugawa shogunate. Large-scale renovations were carried out at a later date. The national treasure Ninomaru Palace, Otemon Gate, Sumiyagura Turret, and Honmaru Palace are important cultural assets. The Ninomaru Garden is a national special place of scenic beauty.



·Walk or take the bus from A1 Shijō-Ōmiya Station. ·Take the Kyoto City Subway Tozai Line from

A5 Randen-Tenjingawa Station and get off at 'Nijojo-mae" Station".

Kitano Line

The ancient temples of world cultural heritages and age-old, famous temples from the Heian Dynasty (794 to 1195) to the Muromachi period (1336 to 1573) can be found here and there along the tram line, Please transfer at Katabiranotsuji on the Arashiyama Line,

Ninnaji Temple

Monzeki Temple, the former imperial palace, was first requested to be built by Emperor Koukou and finally established during the reign of Emperor Uda. Ninnaji Temple is famous for its grounds with many places of interest, its delicate and beautiful



palace and the late-blooming Omurozakura cherry blossoms. ·Walk about 3 minutes from 65 Omuro-Ninnaji Station.

Myōshinji Temple

This temple was established when Emperor Hanazono renewed his imperial villa as a Zen temple and appointed Kanzan Egen as the founder. There are 46 sub-temples located on this vast mountain. An Unryu-zu (painting of dragon and clouds) has been drawn on the ceiling of the lecture hall by Kano Tan'yu



·Walk about 3 minutes from B6 Myōshinji Station.

Ryōanji Temple was founded by

Katsumoto Hosokawa. It is the site of Japan's most famous stone garden with 15 stones and white sand. The Chisoku wash basin, said to have been donated by Mitsukuni Mito, and Kyoyo-ike Pond in the fall are popular draws.

·Walk about 7 minutes from B7 Ryōanji Station.

Tōjiin Temple

This temple was founded by Shogun Takauji Ashikaga. It is the family temple of the Ashikaga shogun. Successive generations of shoguns are enshrined here. Hokyoin pagoda, which houses Ashikaga's tomb, has been built



between two gardens arranged around the Lotus Pond and Heart-shaped Pond that are said to have been created by Soseki Muso.

·Walk about 5 minutes from B Tōiiin Ritsumeikan University Station.

Kitano Tenmangu Shrine

This is the main shrine for all the tenmangu shrines in Japan, where Sugawara no Michizane, revered as the god of learning, is enshrined. It is known as one and is open to the public in the of the best scenic spots in Kyoto spring and fall. The grounds are crowded with visitors on the 25th of every month.



·Walk about 5 minutes from (B9) Kitano-Hakubaichō Station.

Kinkakuii Temple (Golden Pavilion)

This is the sub-temple of Shokokuji Temple. It is called Kinkakuji Temple for its famed golden reliquary hall. After Yoshimitsu Ashikaga's death, it was converted from a mountain villa to a temple with Kokushi Muso named as founder.


·Walk about 15 minutes from B9 Kitano-Hakubaichō
