



This shrine, said to have been built in the 6th to 7th centuries, is worshipped as the deity whose grace cures the sickness of children. Ema (votive tablet) Exhibition Museum (10AM to 3PM, 300 JPY entrance fee) is annexed, the collection of which includes important tangible cultural properties.

The temple is famous for its garden, where layers of maple trees cover the area in the autumn, contrasting vividly with the green moss. Later in the season, fallen leaves cover the entire garden floor crimson



This shrine has been standing here for a long time. Its Shinkoretsu (Procession of the Divine) to welcome the Wild Spirit from Mikage-jinja Shrine to Kamomiso-jinja (a.k.a., Shimogamo-jinja) Shrine, held during the Mikage Matsuri Festival, a pre-ceremony held at the shrine for the Aoi Matsuri Festival, one of the three largest festivals in Kyoto, is considered to be among the oldest of its kind in Japan.

The Enryaku-ji Temple on Mt. Hiei is the head temple of the Tendai sect of Buddhists, and was founded in 788 A.D. There are hundreds of halls and temples scattered throughout the mountain. Each of the four seasons has its own color of beauty, such as the cherry blossoms of spring, the fresh verdure of summer, and the foliage of autumn.

January 1st, 2024, Enryaku-ji Temple, Mt. Hiei



This area is the origin of the Enryaku-ji Temple. Many important buildings such as the Great Lecture Hall and the Amida-do Hall are clustered around the Konpon Chu-do Hall in the center.

Access: 7 min. by Mt. Hiei Shuttle Bus from Hiei Sancho station, get off at the Enryakuji Bus Center stop.



An area surrounded by cedar trees with the Shaka-do Hall in the center. The area is also known for the cherry blossoms and green maple leaves in spring.


Access: 10 min. by Mt. Hiei Shuttle Bus from Hiei Sancho station. get off at the Sai-to stop.



The most nature-filled area in Mt. Hiei. Yokawa Chu-do Hall is the vermilion-lacquered building in Butai-zukuri style modeled after the envoy ship to the Tang Dynasty.


#### Garden Museum Hiei

### 프 Eizan Cable Car

The Eizan Cable Car opened in December 1925 as a means of travel from Kyoto to Mt. Hiei. The line connects the 1.3 km



between Cable Yase and Cable Hiei stations in approximately 9 minutes. The elevation difference of 531 meters between the two stations is the highest in Japan.

#### 🔁 Eizan Ropeway

A ropeway that connects the 486 meters between Rope Hiei station, halfway up the mountain, and Hiei Sancho station at the top in approximately 3 minutes. The view of downtown Kyoto from the slopes of Mt. Hiei is magnificent.



### Eizan Railway Car "Hiei"

The car features a bold design using an oval shape as a motif to symbolize the sacred impression of the Hiei and Kurama areas. Runs daily except for Tuesdays between Demachiyanagi and Yase-Hieizanguchi stations.


